- President (or Chair) states the motion so that all are clear on exactly what is under discussion and the person making the motion is allowed to speak first in regards to the motion
- Motion can NOW be discussed
- Vote is taken: "Those in favor say aye"
- President (or Chair) announces result and action to be taken





Because we are now a one-chapter state, I have set, as our first priority, the recruitment of new members for our chapter. We must increase and activate our membership to insure the growth,




