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
All American Chapter

Hi Women of Today Members!

Welcome to Trimester 3 and warmer weather! Now is the time for the big push to accomplish the goals you set for yourself during Trimester 1. I know you can all do it, you have the strength and perseverance to achieve great things! I hope you are thinking about your next step in Women of Today for the 2025-2026 year. Below is information that can help with your elections.

Remember to send me your Bylaws and Policies so I can review them for you. Also, my 3rd Trimester Challenge is to **send** me information of your Bylaws and Policy review. Date, time, how many motions came from it if you held it already. You will get your name in a drawing for a gift card.

BYLAWS AND YOUR STATE/CHAPTER ELECTIONS!

Leadership is always an important aspect of an organization's success. But remember it's not the title that gives someone power - a person holding a leadership position only has the power that is given to that position as stated in the bylaws. Be sure to remind those members that are interested in a leadership role in your state/chapter to review the bylaws and policies to see what duties and responsibilities are outlined there. They are responsible for performing those duties, whether the person who held the office before them did or not. A suggestion would be to hand out or place in the newsletter that section of the bylaws.

Before you begin the nomination and election process you NEED to check your state/chapter/district bylaws. There are rules regulating your elections and nominations in the bylaws and you MUST follow them.

WHO NOMINATES AND HOW DO YOU DO IT?

A nomination is a formal proposal to the voting body in an election to fill an office or position, suggesting a particular person as the one who should be elected. Common methods of nominations are:

- Nominations by a committee Nominations from the floor
- Nominations by the chair Nomination by ballot
- Nominations by mail Nomination by petition

Nominations by committee and from the floor are the most common methods. They are usually done in connection with each other. The nominating committee first gives its report and then the presiding officer asks for nominations from the floor.

Nominating Committee

Candidates for offices may be selected by a nominating committee. The committee should consider nominees who have demonstrated the abilities to handle the jobs for which they are nominated. Most state/chapter/district bylaws list special qualifications for office holders. The nominating committee may be composed of outgoing officers or senior members because they should understand the duties required of the offices. It is most common to include the Past President and two other members from your chapter. Refer to your state/chapter/district bylaws.

Nomination Process

When the nominating committee is called for its report, the chairman rises and says, "Ms. President, the nominating committee submits the following nominations. For President, Mary A., For Vice President, Sally M. etc."

Nominations do not require a second. As the nomination is made, the chairman repeats it and the secretary records it. It is not necessary to accept the report of the nominating committee. Nominations made by a committee are treated just as if made by members from the floor. The chairman must inquire if there are any further nominations. No member may nominate more than one candidate for each office.

It is not necessary to have a motion to close nominations when only one name for an office is suggested. Two calls for additional nominations should be sufficient to ensure that all who wish to make nominations have had an opportunity to do so. If no additional names are suggested for an office, the chairman may announce, "The nominations are closed, and we shall proceed with the election.

A motion to close the nominations may be made if the list of candidates is getting too long. It is not debatable and requires a two-thirds vote to pass.

Prior to voting but following the formal closing of nominations, nominations may be reopened by a motion, which requires only a majority to carry.

Voting on Nominations

If all nominations are completed at once, you can use a single ballot to vote for all offices, this is a faster ballot vote than doing each office separately.

The tellers then tally the votes and the results are given to the chair to announce. If there is an office where there was no majority, the chair announces "no election" and another ballot is done. For offices where a majority was won, the chair announces the winner. Balloting continues until someone has won the majority of votes.

We have four bylaws and five policies that will be voted on at National Year End Meeting in Duluth. The policies will be voted on at the Board of Directors meeting and the bylaws will be voted on at the Business meeting. The motions are listed below:

Bylaw motions:

I move that we delete the wording in Article II, Section 1, which states, "The purpose of this corporation shall be to encourage, foster and support the growth and establishment of the U.S. Women of Today state and local member chapters," and replace with:

Section 1 Mission, Vision, Benefits

A. Mission Statement

"Our mission is to provide opportunities in the areas of community service, leadership training, personal growth and work in partnerships with multiple charities."

B. Vision Statement

"We are passionate people of action... Empowering individuals to make a difference in their lives and communities."

C. Benefits Statement

Benefits from participating in Women of Today:

- . United in our vison to make a difference through service and community involvement
- · Enrich and empower women in our communities
- · Foster a welcoming and inclusive social experience
- Women gain confidence to lead
- Creating supportive connections as we develop lifelong friendships.

I move that we relocate Article II, Section 2, which states, "This organization shall be non-partisan and non-sectarian. It shall wholly abstain from any political affiliation or endorsement of candidates for political office and be dedicated solely to performing functions affecting the civic, educational, recreational, and social interests of the community, state, and nation," to Article I and renumber as Section 7.

I move that we remove the word PURPOSE from ARTICLE II PURPOSE AND CREED to read: ARTICLE II CREED.

I move that we change Article II Section 3 to be titled **Article II CREED.**

Policy motions:

I move that we amend Policy 2, Section 1.B. by adding the words 'a' and 'Program Managers' so that it reads: The internal programming area shall have a Wellness and Personal Development Program Manager.

I move that we amend Policy 2, Section 3.C.1.A. to read **Writing Competition \$5.00**.

I move that we add Policy 2, Section 3.C.3. to read **Minimum of three (3) competitors for Speaking and Writing competitions.**

I move that we remove Board of Directors and replace with Executive Committee in Policy 13, Section 1.A.5. so that it reads: Dues Billing Contract Committee will make a recommendation for dues billing provider to the **Executive**Committee for approval at the National Mid-Year Meeting.

I move that we remove Board of Directors and replace with Executive Committee and add the word National in Policy 13, Section 2.A.5. so that it reads: Webmaster Contract Committee will make a recommendation for Webmaster to the **Executive Committee** for approval at the **National** Mid-Year Meeting.

This year all orders will be placed and paid for online. There will be two options for receiving your orders:


- 1. You can pick up the fudge/caramels at year end convention in Duluth. (Or have someone pick up your order for you.)

TREASURER CHECK LIST FOR YEAR END

Have all the checks been issued and all deposits completed for the 2024-25 period? There should be a record of each check and each deposit – provide written detail as necessary so that the incoming treasurer and/or audit committee can verify financial transactions for the year.
 Are all bank statements reconciled to the checkbook and any other accounts? The incoming treasurer will want to start the year with balanced books. Also, include a list of outstanding checks and deposits.
 _ Provide incoming treasurer with copies of all monthly (or other timed reporting) treasurer reports.
 Are budget records up to date? Use these records to provide a report that compares budgeted income and expenses to what was actually received and spent. This report will provide a financial history for your chapter for the year, and it can be used to develop a budget for the new year.
 Has all project activity been reported to the state and national levels? Please make sure you do so as this information can be used for public relations purposes and in grant applications.
 Are all renewals and new members accounted for, and dues mailed in to your state contact? This will ensure that the members are accurately recorded, and dues are paid to the USWT.
 _ If your state requires collection and payment of sales tax, have you taken care of the required reporting and payment? If not, check with your appropriate state office for assistance.

TIPS FOR THE NEW YEAR

- Contact the bank for your checking/savings accounts to find out what is needed to update the signature cards.
- Oversee preparation of the budget for the new year. You should be able to use your records from current and prior years to determine the budget for the new year. The budget should be approved by the chapter members as soon as possible at the start of the new year.
- Train the new treasurer and be available to answer questions.
- Check to make sure the records are complete—and then turn them over to the new treasurer.
- An audit/review of the current ending year treasurer books is highly recommended.
 Arrange to get the necessary records for the audit/review committee. (You should not be part of the committee but be available for questions.)

A Few Helpful Hints to Having Useful Minutes

- 1) Type your minutes as soon as possible. You will be surprised how quickly we forget what our scribbles really mean.
- 2) Ask for written reports! Use Motion Slips!
- 3) Make sure your minutes answer who, what, where, when and why.
- 4) Be brief and concise. Minutes should record decisions made and actions taken not what is said.
- 5) Record events in the past tense.
- 6) Publish your minutes in your chapter/district newsletter.
- 7) It is not necessary to make a motion to accept the minutes. Minutes are approved by the membership, either as written or with noted corrections/additions.
- 8) Minutes should contain:
 - A. Name, date, place and type of meeting
 - B. Time convened and adjourned
 - C. Attendance list
 - D. Whether a quorum is present. Refer to your bylaws for what constitutes a quorum.
 - E. Treasurer's report of account balances
 - F. Action taken on items of business
 - G. Information on projects such as date, programming area, number of members participating, dollars raised and to whom donated, and service hours.
- 9) Remember, minutes are factual recordings of any action taken. Be certain that you listen closely and are clear on what was discussed.

Tips for Retention

- We have members who we have not seen in a while, now what? Share with them the highlights of the upcoming meeting. Offer them a ride. Give them a reason to show up.
- We have a lot of long-term members who do not contribute like they used to, now what? Include an information article each month in your newsletter. Keep topics positive and group orientated. Consider topics like the benefits of being a big sis, why co-chairs make volunteering fun, the benefits of having prepared reports at general meetings, and how volunteering is good for the body and mind.
- Some members are losing interest. Personally invite members to participate in your chapter's socials and events. Ask them to co-chair projects with you. Send them a participation survey to see what they are interested in.
- Longtime members are only active part-time. Ask them if everything is okay, do they need anything? Ask them to co-chair projects with you. Make it a group effort. Each month have a different member calling other members to participate in your chapter socials. Ask them to be a Big Sis/Buddy. Remind them that they have a lot to offer a new member.
- Announce and notify members at the beginning of each trimester that their renewal dues are coming up. Affirm their value to your chapter. Invite them to renew their membership.

Tips to Help you Start and Successfully Complete an Extension:

- When considering a good location for a new chapter, there are many things to think about—where is a new community that has no previous connection to our projects and membership events; what areas are developing with new schools and new housing neighborhoods; what towns lie on the border of states that already have chapters and could bring about collaboration of chapters from two states; and geographically what communities could bring chapters closer to each other.
- Important aspects to remember when recruiting new members in a new community can include emphasizing the benefit of social connections and support of friendships, an age variability which can bring value in energy, resources, and wisdom; projects that can help the community but be fun in which members can participate. Each community will have its own unique characteristics as far as age, service projects, other organizations with which to partner.
- Want help with the "Best Tips" to get started and get your members excited, contact me and I can help!
- Extensions is basically a step further from recruiting, just with people you may not know. One way to start might be to invite prospective members to your own chapter meeting so they can get a feel for what our organization is all about. If you are on an Extensions team and become part of the spark and energy of new members, it can be very rewarding and energizing.

Signs of Love Bombing

Love bombing is an attempt to influence another person with over-the-top displays and affection. The typical story involves an uninterested character who is being pursued by an eager suitor. The pursuer consistently violates the uninterested character's boundaries until they fall in love and decide to be together. This kind of behavior is a form of emotional abuse, and although it can be experienced during any stage of a relationship, it is often seen in the early stages of getting to know one another.

There are many ways a person can exhibit signs of love bombing, but here are four common examples that will help you identify if love bombing is happening to you or someone you know.

Sign #1 "Soulmate" Status

When love bombing occurs, often labels such as "soulmate", "their person," or "their other half" are applied early in the relationship. While it may feel validating to be considered as an important figure in their lives, it could be a cause for concern if you have not known them very long, or if you feel uncomfortable.

Sign #2 Exaggerated Compliments

Compliments are a great way to show that you're interested in each other. It is not unusual to exchange compliments in a relationship, especially as you are getting to know one another. However, if the comments your partner is making seem over-the-top, it could be another sign of love bombing, especially if they make you feel uneasy. Here are some examples:

"I can't imagine finding anyone more perfect than you." "My life would be nothing without you"

Sign #3 Gifts

Receiving gifts is a thoughtful way to show you care about your partner. However, receiving presents could be a tactic used to manipulate the relationship later. f gifts are later associated with stipulations such as "I paid your mortgage this month, so don't speak to me like that," or "I bought you drinks, so you owe me and dance," they could be an additional sign of love bombing. If you feel uncomfortable about the gifts you receive, it could be a good idea to have a conversation with your partner about your concerns.

Sign #4 Communication Overload

When you first establish your relationship, you may speak to your partner more frequently, because you are learning about each other and your desires for your relationship. Good communication is required to have a solid and healthy relationship, but you should not be feeling overwhelmed by the amount of communication you are receiving. This could be an excellent time to talk about how you feel and find a way to communicate with each other that works for both of you.

US Buckets of Sunshine Year End Project Support of Safe Haven, Duluth MN

Safe Haven Shelter and Resource Center serves a seven-county area in northern Minnesota. They provide services and education for more than 1,500 adults and children annually. Their Mission is to provide safety, space to heal, advocacy, and empowerment for women, children, and all survivors of domestic violence.

Below is a "WISH LIST" of items the shelter can use. Feel free to start collecting items and bring them to Year-End 2025 in Duluth, MN in June. Monetary donations are also being accepted. Checks made out to "US Women of Today" with "Buckets of Sunshine 2025" in the memo line. They can be sent to USWT Public Relations Director Cindy Golbuff.

- **Bedding:** Twin, Full- & Queen-sized comforters and blankets, twin sized sheets, pillowcases, large throw blankets and pillows. We are NOT in need of baby blankets at this time.
- **Culturally specific hair care products:** Brushes, jam combs, hair grease, hair lotions, shampoos, conditioners, and hair scarves, wraps, or bonnets.
- Cleaning items: Clorox wipes, all purpose cleaners, tall garbage bags, laundry pods, laundry bags and paper towels.
- **Bathroom items:** Body towels, wash cloths and toilet paper.
- **Hygiene products:** Deodorant, body wash, toothpaste, lotion, razors, combs and menstrual products (pads and tampons).
- Clothing items: We ask that these items all be new and unused. Sweatpants, pajamas, sports bras, bras, underwear, flip-flops, hard bottom slippers, socks (specifically for women's shoe size 8 and larger). We are NOT accepting any used clothing donations at this point.
- **General items:** Water bottles, forks, spoons, journals, notebooks, undated planners, backpacks, duffle bags, first aid kits, ear buds and noise cancelling headphones, no-contract, pay by the minute phones and old cell phones.
- Infant items: Baby wipes, diapers (we are currently only in need of size 4 and larger).
- Seasonal items: Winter coats and winter boots.

Upcoming with Valley of the Sun Women of Today is assisting with a Pie Auction for Multiple Sclerosis and an annual bake sale in Sunland Village.


